

She was also a member of the first committee of the state federation which inaugurated the traveling-library movement. Mr. James L. King was the first secretary, 19001901. He, as state librarian, is now chairman of the Commission. The president of the State Federation of Womens Clubs is an ex officio member of the Commission, Mrs. H. 0. Garvey being the present member. Mrs. Julia E. Brown, of Blue Rapids, Kan., has been a member of the Commission since 1905, and Mrs. Sara Judd...
